About Purbeck

The property ranges from the ruins of Corfe Castle in the west to Shell Bay at the end of the Studland peninsula to the east. On the southern boundary of the property lies the Purbeck coast with its dramatic sea cliffs and age old stone quarries around Acton and Langton Matravers. On the northern boundary lie some of the best tracts of lowland heath in Britain supporting every species of British reptile.

While in Dorset, anyone with an interest in nature and prehistory will be drawn to the Purbeck Estate which boasts one of Britain's best beaches at Studland, two National Nature Reserves and is home to the richest ten square miles of wild flowers in the country. From the dinosaur-era Purbeck limestones to the recent sand dunes of Studland, nowhere else packs such a variety of habitats into such a small area.
